PIPEDA requires explicit, informed consent before collecting customer information. Generic privacy policies don't meet the standard—consent must be specific and documented.

4 Bundling Warranties Without Opt-Out

Tying warranties to product purchases without clear opt-out provisions violates FTC guidelines and can be considered a deceptive practice.

5 Unclear Claims Processes

Vague terms, hidden exclusions, or overly complex claim procedures violate both FTC and FSRA standards for transparency and good faith dealings.
